In 2000, at a UN Summit, the UN Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) were defined. The MDGs were the body's flagship plan to eliminate poverty across the globe with a target date of 2015.

When 2015 came to a close and the world took a look at the progress that had been made, it was clear that although more than a billion people had been lifted out of poverty — many of the MDGs were not complete successes. In fact, some had failed outright.

One of the major MDG failures is the fact that the success of the goals was not experienced equally across the globe; this in itself is a major defeat. In 2015 the UNGA approved the new Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), 17 global goals that would be part of the global development agenda 2015-2030.

In the same year (2015) we launched our international mentoring programmes 'Telemachus' for youth and 'Athena' for women as our pledge to actively support the economic empowerment of young people and women, through personal development, knowledge transfer and access to opportunities. These two programmes have been our active contribution towards the UN's Sustainable Development Goals.

In 2020 we are celebrating our 5th Anniversary. Within 5 years I am enormously proud of the work that we have been accomplishing. I am also deeply grateful to our dedicated Board, our Partner organisations, our brilliant mentors and our generous Sponsors for making these programmes a reality.

Within 5 years our reach is in over 45 countries, 5,100 mentoring sessions have been conducted and more than 5,000 individuals have been directly and indirectly benefitted from our programmes. The case studies in this report are only a small sample of the tangible work achieved.

We are immensely passionate about our mentee's achievements. Visionary young people and women of all ages, each of them working towards one of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. It brings tears of joy to my eyes when I hear the enthusiasm and passion with which our mentees speak about the learning journeys and watershed moments with our mentors.

GLOBAL THINKERS FORUM

GTF is a non-profit headquartered in London and was officially launched in 2012 in Jordan under the patronage of Her Majesty Queen Rania of Jordan. Today, Global Thinkers Forum has a network of influencers and partners that reach more than 70 countries around the world and engages leaders across business, philanthropy, academia, science, civil society, NGOs and government. In 2014 GTF launched 'Global Thinkers mentors' (GTM) and its mentoring programmes 'Athena' & 'Telemachus' with a goal to nurture accountable leadership and support youth and women in their efforts to build better societies. Global Thinkers mentors Inc is registered as 5(0)1c 3 in the US.

The programmes are designed to give talented young men and women the guidance, confidence and skills that they need to fulfil their potential. This potential doesn't just transform their own lives, it helps transform positively the societies and communities in which they live through the launch of solutions-focused projects.

Programmes focus on:

Social Entrepreneurship: Finding Solutions, Creating Jobs

Social entrepreneurship is a driver of sustainable economic development around the world, creating jobs and strengthening communities. We equip young people (Telemachus) and women (Athena) of all ages with entrepreneurial skills by providing individual mentoring support through trained business mentors and specialised entrepreneurship training.

Women's Empowerment: Overcoming Obstacles, Aiming High

Thought leaders of international stature are connected with female mentees who aspire to advance their professional career and break glass ceilings. Our mentees have the opportunity to build valuable relationships with their mentors and they 'graduate' ready to launch new projects, new career beginnings to take their organisations up to new levels and scale.

Embracing Diversity: A Programme for Future Leaders

Mentees are paired with accomplished mentors from diverse countries. The programme is designed to promote global connectivity, exposing mentees to diversity of thought but also global and regional opportunities. Our mentees are provided with a personalised development opportunity to address individual learning needs. Mentees also become part of the broader Global Thinkers Forum community and get involved in initiatives and our network.




Our Athena mentees are usually post-graduates, mid-career women or entrepreneurs of vision, ambition and commitment towards valuable causes. Average age range: 32-45






Through the Athena MENA Mentoring programme and the interactions with her mentor, she learned to manage her time efficiently as well as handle challenges in her professional environment. She says that this made a huge difference to her life as it allowed her to have a clear vision of her actual goals and establish a clear plan of work.

'Social Change in Kenya: One Youth at a Time'




Victor Odhiambo from Kenya (Mentee)

He founded 'The Garden of Hope' as an organisation conducting leadership and entrepreneurship training. In 2015 he was 27 and he applied for the Global Thinkers Mentors Programme to build his skills in leading his organisation effectively and efficiently. Victor was paired with his mentor Roula Douglas, from Lebanon. Roula is a well-known journalist, author, human rights activist for women and youth. By working closely with Victor, over a period of eight months, Roula provided him with the professional guidance, strategic thinking and personal support to help him make the 'Garden of Hope' a big success story. From reading material to content creation, Roula's role was key in unlocking Victor's leadership skills. Currently 3,500 youth and women from different communities in Kenya have benefitted from the programmes.

Yidnekachew is a passionate advocate for youth and health. His vision for his country is to see a gender-based, violence-free society. He applied for the Global Thinkers Mentors programme in 2018. He was paired with Ethiopian-American mentor, Bofta Yimam.

One of Yidnekachew's biggest takeaways from the programme was that he learned to adapt a solutions-oriented approach in his work. Alongside professional and personal guidance, Bofta also helped him navigate through a highly competitive selection process for the Youth Champion Initiative (YCI), that helps improve sexual and reproductive health in Ethiopia, Rwanda, India, Pakistan, and the United States. Yidnekachew is now the winner of the 2019 Students Project for Health competition, recognising students who have made outstanding contributions to projects promoting community health and well-being. As a recipient of the award he had the opportunity to present his winning project during the global conference of The Network Towards Unity for Health, in Darwin Australia in September 2019.

Through the programme Yidnekachew has already become an agent of change in the field of community health.

Dina grew up in Kuwait until the age of 9 when the First Gulf war broke out. She and her family fled to neighboring Jordan, and a year later to Syria where they spent three years. Unable to find employment in either country, they relocated to the US and eventually Canada. As Dina explained, moving to the US as immigrants in their late fifties, her parents were not able to provide her with the guidance and mentorship that she needed. The roles reversed and she became the one helping them navigate their way around an unfamiliar culture and contributing financially. She had to constantly take jobs to pay the bills. She yearned for a mentor and wished that she had someone to guide her.

Dina applied for the Global Thinkers Mentors programme in 2018 and in 2019 she was paired with Sue Rocco the Founder, Producer and Host of 'Women to Watch Media' – the premier global media platform for women leaders. Dina is currently working on a project targeting stay-at-home mothers and women, offering them an opportunity to work remotely by linking them with companies looking to hire part-time and remote workers.

Vanessa Hernandez from Honduras (Mentee)

Vanessa has studied in Taipei, Taiwan receiving a B.B.A in International Business. She speaks Spanish, English, Mandarin Chinese and Italian. Vanessa's passion is social entrepreneurship. Vanessa applied for the programme in 2016 and was paired with George Constantopoulos.

Thanks to Global Thinkers Forum and her mentor George Constantopoulos Vanessa's business idea eventually became fully operational. Don Maslow Coffee was born, as a specialty coffee social enterprise that is supporting the mission to save the rainforest in Honduras by using renewable energy and traditional methods. They also use 100% compostable packaging. Starting one's own business can be quite lonely. By being able to share her concerns with her mentor Vanessa felt more relaxed about taking the path of entrepreneurship. Vanessa is currently running the Partnerships department for Don Maslow Coffee and pursuing partnerships with businesses, that like hers, love coffee and care about environmental issues too.

'Finding Your Own Voice & Giving Voice to Others'



Hanne Vrebos from Belgium (Mentee)

Hanne was born and raised in a small village in Belgium. While working at an architectural office in São Paulo, she came across the harsh challenges of spatial inequality, inadequate infrastructure and rapid urbanisation. Hanne decided to focus on improving settlements and urban processes from a human perspective. She applied for the GTF Mentoring programme in 2017 and was connected to Helen Alderson, Director of the International Red Cross for UK and Ireland. At the time Hanne was trying to build up her career in the humanitarian and development sectors. As a young professional she had discovered that technical expertise is not enough. Having the confidence and social skills to express ideas and opinions for people at different levels is just as important. Mentorship with GTF helped her to develop that insight. Through the sessions with Helen she learned to put away her fear and became confident to step forward. For instance, at a group meeting in Haiti, Hanne was the only woman and she felt that she was being ignored during team introductions; but having built her confidence she was triggered to speak up, which afterwards earned her respect among peers and superiors.

PARTNERSHIP CASE STUDY: MENTORING 100 WOMEN IN THE MENA REGION TOGETHER WITH UAE-BASED NAMA



Women's education in the Arab world has increased substantially in the last several decades, both in absolute terms and relative to men. Various GCC governments have rapidly improved female access to higher education to the extent that in many countries, female graduates now outnumber male graduates. Female talent and women's capacity to support the local economies is abundant. In 2018 the Athena MENA Mentoring Programme was launched in partnership with NAMA to support 100 women from the MENA region to become business and community leaders by 2020. Sharjah's NAMA Women Advancement Establishment (NAMA) together with Global Thinkers Forum (GTF) embarked on a journey together to help women in the region develop new skills and expertise, and to enhance, enrich and expand their professional and personal prospects. The two organisations confirmed the launch of the programme at a signing ceremony held in London.



NAMA's goal has been to partner with a globally recognised and connected organisation to support women locally and in the wider MENA region and equip them with leadership skills which can help them chart their own future path.

Through the Athena MENA Mentoring Programme we develop the talents, abilities and business acumen of 100 women above the age of 22, who are based in the MENA region and providing them with support and networking opportunities, while give them a deeper insight into modern business practices.

The programme offers guidance, mentorship, and professional advice for mentees by deepening their understanding of international markets and helping them with confidence-building. Adopting scientific and practical strategies and clear action plans for the inclusion of women in local, regional and global economies, the programme encourages women to launch and set up their own enterprises, a forward-thinking scheme that leads to creating a generation of active women leaders. The Global Thinkers Forum provides NAMA and the Athena MENA Programme with an elite group of highly-experienced mentors, many of whom are CEOs and directors of leading international companies and organisations, to present workshops and training sessions to mentees. Moving into its next stage in 2020 an 2021 the programme will introduce new initiatives and reinforce both the knowledge process but also access to global networks and opportunities.
